Rally Tasmania / Heritage Rally is based in the sea side City of Burnie on the picturesque North West Coast of Tasmania. With a total distance of approx 750 kms including around 220kms of closed road special stages, and a 1 km special stage around the Burnie CBD, Rally Tasmania is one of Australia's premier Tarmac Rallies.
