### Whiteman Park

### Ceremonial Start in Forrest Place

Friday, the 26<sup>th</sup> is the ceremonial start in Perth's Forrest Place and Murray Street Mall. The entire field will be there from 7.30am and the first car is flagged away at 9.00am. Again, it's a rare chance to see the entire field, take pictures, listen to the commentary and enjoy the atmosphere. From there, the cars head off to the RAC Driving Centre, near the International Airport, for Special Stage 3, then next on to the Hills for another stage in the John Forrest National Park, followed by the Summerslegal Zig Zag and the very popular and fast Kalamunda stage on Mundaring Weir Road.

This is where the event gets into the fast, flowing special stages in the Toodyay hills and on Sunday the main street will be closed off and used as the official rally service park. ### Bullsbrook

After running as trial stages last year the two Bullsbrook stages will be run twice in quick succession and judging by the feedback from competitors, spectators and residents these stages will once again will be a highlight of the rally.

### Classic Race Car Sprints

A range of classic race cars from the VSCC of WA will perform a series of sprints over the Killarnée City of Perth Super Stage from 10.30am to 1.30pm providing an awesome display of rare and unique historic racing machinery in action.

The rally action starts under the Arch on Plain Street at 2.00pm and all rally crews will complete 3 runs over the 2.69km Killarnée City of Perth Super Stage. This will be a fitting Grand Finale to the rally and there will be no better place to get up close and see the rally cars in full flight as they compete against the clock at 15 second intervals.

Finally, a parade lap and then presentation of the Finishers Medallions will take place under the Arch on Plain Street, next to Langley Park.
