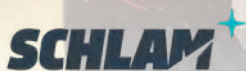

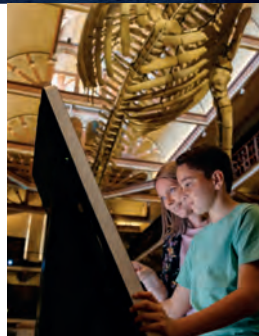

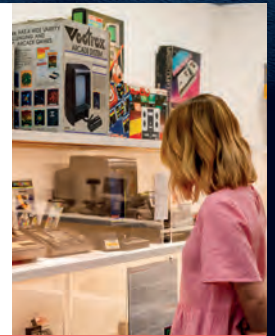

# Supplementary Regulations

## ARTICLE 1 - ORGANISATION

- 1.1 The 2023 Make Smoking History September Rallysprints will be a National Rallysprint and will be run under the provisions of the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Australian Auto Sport Alliance (AASA), alongside these Supplementary Regulations, Tarmac West Technical Regulations and authorised Further Regulations and Bulletins.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with AASA Health, Safety and Environment Policy <https://aasa.com.au/wp-content/uploads/AASA-2023-Appendix-2-HSE-Policy.pdf>

The Events will count towards the 2023 Make Smoking History Tarmac Cup Series.

### ARTICLE 3 - EVENT DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The events will be conducted at **Ellenbrook, Malaga and City**.
- 3.2 All competitors must do two Reconnaissance runs after the drivers briefing. Speed limit is 50km/h. The use of Competition Rally Cars for reconnaissance is strictly forbidden, except for the day of the event. Driving on the wrong side of the road will result in exclusion from the Event except after the roads are closed for the Event.
- 3.3 Each Event will be run over one stage.

- 3.4 The Start Order will be in numerical order, seeded order from fastest to slowest.
- 3.5 Drivers are to start on a Green Light. The traffic light sequence is:
- 10 seconds Red (Wait)  
5 seconds Amber (Ready)  
0 Green (Go)
- The driver should "go on green" but their time doesn't start until they break the beam.
- The Green stays on for five (5) seconds and then there is a short blip of the Red light until ten (10) seconds before next car where the above repeats. This "blip" is the "move up to the line" gap.
- The abort sequence** is Red and Amber together followed by alternating Red and Amber. If both lights come on at any time, including during the last ten (10) seconds, the driver should abort the start.
- 3.6 Re-runs will be authorised at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course and only where a competitor's run has been unfairly compromised or in the event of a timing failure.
- 3.7 A map showing the route is attached at the back of these Regulations. Route Instructions will be provided by the Organisers Online and at Scrutiny.

### ARTICLE 4 - TIMING AND RESULTS

- 4.1 Timing will be to the tenth of a second. Times will be available on [www.mstair.com.au](http://www.mstair.com.au) during the event.
- 4.2 Crews will depart start controls at no less than 30 second intervals. Such departures shall be single vehicle starts.
- 4.3 Penalties



- (i) Any vehicle hitting any part of the chicane or course markers (bollards) requiring an official to relocate them, or failing to traverse a chicane correctly will receive a five (5) second penalty; and
  - (ii) Any vehicle travelling the incorrect side of bollard or chicane marker will receive a thirty (30) second penalty.
- 4.4 Crews must be aware and comply with the requirements of the AASA Rallysprint Standing Regulations.
- 4.5 Provisional results will be available 15 minutes after the last car has completed each event.
- 4.6 The results will be determined by the competitor who achieves the lowest aggregate elapsed time for each event. All stages count towards the Results.

#### ARTICLE 5 - VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY

- 5.1 All vehicles must conform to the requirements of the AASA NCRs and the Rallysprint Standing Regulations (RSRs). Further to the RSRs:
- 5.1.1 The event will be open to two wheel and four-wheel drive vehicles.
- 5.1.2 Tyres must be marked legal for road use as indicated by the presence of either DOT or ECE markings.  
**Any tyres marked 'not for highway use' / 'for racing use only' or similar are not permitted.**
- 5.2 The Classes will be:
- Tarmac Cup Category for vehicles complying with Tarmac Events Technical Regulations (inc standard cars)**
- (i) 2WD up to 2000cc
  - (ii) 2WD 2000cc & over
  - (iii) 4WD up to 3500cc
  - (iv) 4WD 3500cc & over
  - (v) Electric
  - (vi) 2WD or 4WD Gravel Tyres
  - (vii) Classics Pre-1986
    - (a) 1960's
    - (b) 1970's
    - (c) 1980's
- Open Rallysprint Category**
- (ix) 2WD up to 2000cc
  - (x) 2WD 2000cc & over
  - (xi) 4WD
- 5.3 ROLL OVER PROTECTION:  
Ellenbrook & City Events: Roll Over Protection is not required, an AASA Class 1 Safety Cage is recommended.
- Malaga Event: A minimum of an AASA Class 1 Safety Cage is required.
- 5.4 All vehicles shall be registered for use on public roads. State Authorities, Concessional or Conditional Registration or **Western Australian** Over 48 Hour Temporary Road Permit (Rally) will be allowed (download application from [www.Tarmacwest.com.au](http://www.Tarmacwest.com.au)). The onus is on the competitor to ensure all statutory requirements relating to the use of the Concessional/Conditional Registration or Temporary Road Permit have been met. **Temporary Road permits from other states are not valid in Western Australia.** A "Temporary Movement Permit" is NOT suitable.

#### ARTICLE 6 - CREW ELIGIBILITY

- 6.1 **All drivers must have a Tarmac West seeding i.e. have run in a previous Tarmac Event WA (Targa West) event.**
- 6.2 Crews must consist of two members. The Competitor and both crew members shall be required to hold a current AASA General Speed Licence or superior.
- 6.3 On request to the Organisers, a Competitor may enter multiple times driving different vehicles; however, each vehicle must be from a different Class. This will only be permitted if a full field is not reached. However they will only receive Targa Cup points based on the results obtained by one vehicle. Prior to the start of competition the driver must nominate which vehicle's results are to be used for Targa Cup points.
- 6.4 Should both crew members wish to drive, then this will be permitted under the same crew eligibility rules and a separate entry form and entry fee will be required for each combination of crew.

- 6.5 APPARAL: Crews who have entered events (e.g. Targa West, Targa South West, WA Rally Championship or Clubman Masters/Cup Series, State Racing Championships) where AASA or Motorsport Australia approved helmets, Driving Suits, Frontal Head Restraints, Gloves and Boots have been a requirement, MUST wear them. This applies to vehicles with AASA Class 2 or 3 Safety Cage.

Ellenbrook & City Events: Other Crews must wear non-flammable apparel covering the body from ankles, to neck, to wrists with closed footwear with leather upper, and a AASA approved helmet, Driving Suits, Frontal Head Restraints, Gloves and Boots are strongly recommended.

Malaga Event: All Crew members must wear AASA approved Helmets, Driving Suits, Frontal Head Restraints, Gloves and Boots for tarmac rallying.

Apparel must be presented at Pre-Start Scrutiny. Failure to wear appropriate apparel when competing will result in a recommendation to the Stewards for a penalty which may go as far as exclusion from the Event.

- 6.6 AIR BAGS: For vehicles fitted with a Safety Cage, it is recommended that SRS air bags be disabled and/or removed. If an air bag is not disabled, then nothing shall be mounted in the path of deployment of the air bag (e.g., distance measuring devices). If disabled, a decal to that effect shall be affixed to the automobile adjacent to, or under, the driver and passenger windows.

- 7.1 The Tarmac West Online (TWO) Entry Form is to be completed in full on [www.targawest.com.au](http://www.targawest.com.au)

- 7.5 Entries open **as per the Event Schedule.**

- 7.6 Entries close **as per Event Schedule.**

- 7.7 The number of entries will be limited to **80.**

- 7.8 Competitors under the age of 18 years must have the written consent of a parent or guardian to enter and participate. The minimum age for Drivers is 18 and Co-drivers is 14 years

Competitors, irrespective of age, must have demonstrated competence, including having successfully participated in a suitable and approved driver training course. It is strongly recommended that all intending drivers should drive the specific vehicle in which they are to compete, immediately prior to the event under conditions similar to those that will be experienced during the event.



The fundamental requirement is experience in handling a vehicle at speed. The criterion for acceptance is experience gained from, circuit racing, rallying or advanced driver training.

The Clerk of the Course must be satisfied as to the acceptable motorsport driving experience of crews.

Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCRs of the current AASA Manual.

7.9 Competitors are reminded of the penalties under the NCRs for false statements.

7.10 It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure their entry and payment is received by the organisers before the close of entries.

Withdrawal after entries close, no refund is applicable.

#### ARTICLE 8 - DRIVERS BRIEFING

The Drivers Briefing for all drivers will be held as listed in the Program.

#### ARTICLE 9 - SCRUTINY & DOCUMENTATION

9.1 SCRUTINY:  
Vehicles must be presented for Scrutiny as per Article 2 Event Schedule.

9.2 DOCUMENTATION:  
Competitors must provide the following completed documents via the Tarmac West Online (TWO) system BEFORE 8pm Tuesday after the close of Entries

- AASA Licence
- Current Motorsport Car Club Membership card

Competitors are to Agree to the following

- AASA Disclaimer
- Self-Scrutiny Statement of Vehicle Compliance

If required, a Vehicle Registration / Over 48 Hour Rally Permit must be loaded into the TWO system

9.3 Competitors are advised that any in-car video or moving film cameras must be installed in the vehicle prior to scrutiny so that the camera and its mounting can be inspected. Note: Cameras are NOT to be mounted to a helmet.

9.4 Compulsory equipment which will be checked at scrutiny includes:

- (i) Roll over protection, if installed, either complies with Appendix 1 of the NCRs or if non-compliant, is deemed to be of a safe construction.
- (ii) A fire extinguisher complying with Appendix 3 of the NCRs
- (iii) Helmets and apparel complying with Appendix 4 of the NCR's
- (ii) Full harness seat belts, if installed, that comply with Appendix 5 of the NCRs.
- (iv) Fuel shall be in accordance with the AASA Standing Regulations
- (vi) Reflective safety triangle sides at least 350mm
- (vii) Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions of 95dB (A).

#### ARTICLE 10 - OVERTAKING

Unless a competitor has slowed to significantly below racing speed, the following competitor must not overtake under any circumstances. In the circumstance where a following competitor catches the ahead competitor and both are at race speeds, the following competitor must not overtake under any circumstances and must remain a safe distance (no less than 25 metres) behind the ahead competitor. The following competitor must request a re-run at the STOP control. The Clerk of the Course shall, at his sole discretion, either grant a re-run or issue an adjusted (derived) stage time.

#### ARTICLE 11 - VEHICLE SIGNAGE

Competitors are required to carry the event number and sponsor door plate on the front door on both sides of the car. The sponsor door plate and number are not to be modified. If the car is being used by more than one driver, the number not being used must be clearly crossed out.

Door Plate – 375mm x 300mm

Sponsor Sticker – 500mm x 150mm

#### ARTICLE 12 – AWARDS

11.1 Event Trophies will be awarded for each event to Crews as follows:

**Tarmac Cup Vehicles**

- (i) 1st Tarmac Cup Outright
- (ii) 2nd Tarmac Cup Outright
- (iii) 3rd Tarmac Cup Outright
- (iv) 1st in each Class

**Open Rallysprint Category**

- (v) 1st Open Rallysprint Outright
- (vi) 2nd Open Rallysprint Outright
- (vii) 3rd Open Rallysprint Outright
- (viii) 1st in each Class

#### ARTICLE 13 – MAKE SMOKING HISTORY TARMAC CUP POINTS

- 12.1 Points will be Awarded as per the Make Smoking History Tarmac Cup Matrix.
- 12.2 All eligible competitors will automatically be included in Series Results.
- 12.3 More than one co-driver in the same vehicle will not receive points..
- 12.4 Where a Co-Driver competes in more than one vehicle, they will only score points in the highest placed for Outright and Class.

#### ARTICLE 14 – PROTESTS

Protests, if any, must be lodged in accordance with the NCR's..

#### ARTICLE 15 – ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Any holder of an AASA 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach.

The consumption of any prohibited substance by competitors prior to the conclusion of the Event, and the consumption of any alcoholic beverage by any Competitor, Driver, Co-Driver or 'service' crew, prior to the end of their participation on any day, is forbidden. Failure to comply may result in the imposition of penalties, including but not limited to exclusion of the whole team involved.

The use of any stimulants, depressants, tranquillisers, including but not limited to alcoholic beverages, narcotics etc, during an event is prohibited. AASA shall be the sole judge as to whether such stimulants, depressants or tranquillisers are being used and may require any licence/permit person to undergo a test or tests in furtherance of this rule. See NCR.

#### ARTICLE 16 - POSTPONEMENT, ABANDONMENT OR CANCELLATION

The Event may be abandoned, postponed or cancelled for reasons of force majeure in accordance with the NCR's

- (i) if there are less than 50 entries: or
- (ii) by reason of "Force Majeure".

#### ARTICLE 17 – INSURANCE

Personal Accident insurance is provided under the AASA permit. Details can be found at [www.aasa.com.au](http://www.aasa.com.au)

Crews involved in accidents resulting in property damage are advised that they may be required to pay up to the first \$10,000 of any claim to rectify such property damage.

#### ARTICLE 18 – CITY OF PERTH & SHANNONS SHOW'N'SHINE

- 1. An 8-car display will be in Murray St Mall on Thursday 17 August from 9.00am to 3.00pm
- 2. A 60-car display will be in Forrest Place on Friday 8 September from 5.00pm to 8.30pm.

It is a requirement from the City of Perth for us to run the City Stage that all competitors register for these displays to help promote our sport, events, sponsors your team and sponsors. An event will be set up on the TWO system to register for these promotional events.



**ARTICLE 19 – GALA DINNER & PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES**

The Gala Dinner and presentation of awards will be held at The Hyatt Regency Ballroom on Sunday, 10 September 2023 commencing 1900hrs. Tickets are \$105.00 each and may be ordered through the Tarmac West Online system no later than 2100hrs on Wednesday, 6 September 2023.

Note: Two tickets are NOT included in the Entry Fee.

Trophy winners who don't attend the Presentation of Trophies will have them delivered at a later date.
